Order of difficulty follows the rainbow colours -P1-7 in this order:

Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo, Violet . P7s can also try Magenta if they require more challenge. You can also access previous week's virtual classroom if you wish to do so.

This is not compulsory. It is your choice as a parent whether you wish to access this. Any learning your child wishes to share with your child's teacher, do so via the children's Outlook email just as we did throughout lockdown.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Thank you to everyone continuing to support us in keeping us all safe. Thank you for social distancing and wearing masks whilst picking your children up from school. It is much appreciated by us all.

Staggered starts and finishes will continue this term. Please collect your child at the gate you wish to leave from. Parents and carers are not able to cross the playground to go to the other side of the school, I'm afraid.

The water dispenser in school remains out of use. Please continue to send your children to school with their water bottles. Please remember that, unfortunately we are not permitted to refill the bottles or give out drinks. A few parents have asked us about juice inside bottles in class. Water does remain the only drink that can be taken in class time.

Please continue to support your children in becoming independent. This will enable staff to socially distance. A lot of our children still ask us to support them in opening their snacks, tying laces and fastening their jackets. Please practise these skills at home.

We have also been asked about giving out party invitations. This is not something we are able to do, I am afraid.
