Over the next few weeks we are going to be learning how to:

- Collect and organise information by matching, sorting, grouping and classifying objects.
- Conduct a simple survey (e.g. colours of cars passing the school) and decide how to best to keep a record.
- Record my findings by creating displays such as pictograms.
- Answer simple questions about my information e.g. How many? Which has most/least?

Here are some ideas of how you can help me at home!

On your way to school count how many silver cars, red cars and black cars you can see? Who can spot the most?

Can you sort your toys into different groups? How many soft toys do you have?

What's the most popular eye colour in your house?

How many apples, bananas and tangerines you have at home? Which fruit do you have the least have?
