Over the next few weeks we are going to be learning to:

- Recognise and name familiar shapes in our environment and in play settings.
- Know that shapes can be joined or taken apart to form other shapes.
- Sort 3D objects into groups according to their own and others' criteria do they roll/stack?
- Sort 2D shapes into groups.
- Use 2D/3D shapes in a creative way.
- Use language associated with shape (straight, round, curved, flat) in play and everyday contexts.
- Know that patterns repeat and predict what will come next.
- Copy and continue repeating patterns.
- Create own patterns in a range of ways, singing, playing instruments, art.
- Use language associated with pattern, next, before, after, again.

Here are some ideas of how you can help me at home!

Look at books draw attention to patterns on animals and clothing.

Make your own patterned paper by using cut up vegetables, finger prints, old toy blocks, wheels of cars etc. Use different styles and colours; straight, wavy or curved.

Take it outside - to draw with chalk, any patterns can easily be washed away.

Make it up – make up a dance routine with a repeating movement in the middle.
