I am developing my awareness of how money is used and can recognise and use a range of coins

Over the next few weeks we are going to be learning to:

- Know what money is and how it is used in every day life.
- Be aware that coins and notes have different values.
- Recognise the £ and p symbols.
- Recognise 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p £1 and £2 coins and be able to point them out.
- Appreciate that the exact amount, or a greater amount, of money can be used to pay for items.
- Be aware that change is given when more money is paid than the cost of the item.
- Select the coins and notes which can be used to pay for items in play and real life contexts.
- Discuss whether we have more or less money than the cost of the item and decide whether or not to expect change.
- Use money related vocabulary (e.g. pounds, pence, total, costs, amount, change, spend, how much) in play and real life contexts.

Here are some ideas of how you can help me at home!

Talk about money – talk to your child at home how they use money. Children should choose an example and record this in drawings and/or pictures with workings.

What money? Present a simple shopping list and prices: milk 86p, bread £1, paper 75p etc. Children list the coins they might use to pay for each item.

My piggy bank Get your child to count the coins in their money box, then make a list of how many of each coin do they have.
