Here are some ideas of how you can help me at home!

Butterflies Use paper and paint to make symmetrical butterflies.

Symmetrical Shapes Find and draw one shape which is symmetrical and one which is not.

Copy Cats Play a copying game with an adult using lego or something similar. When finished join the two to make a symmetrical model.
