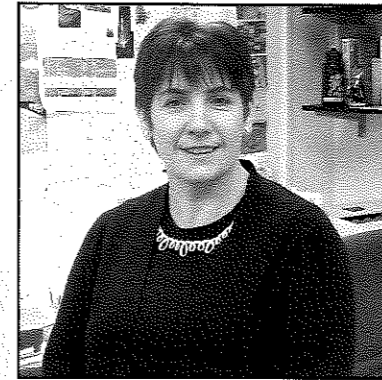




Opening Words

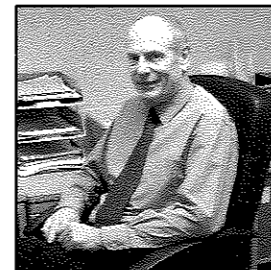

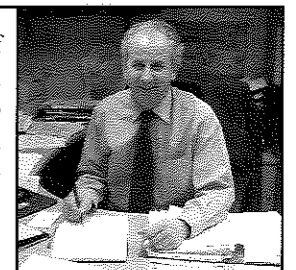

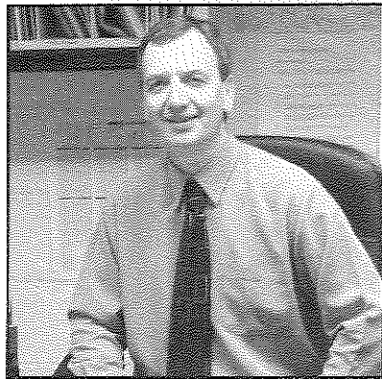

Opening Words

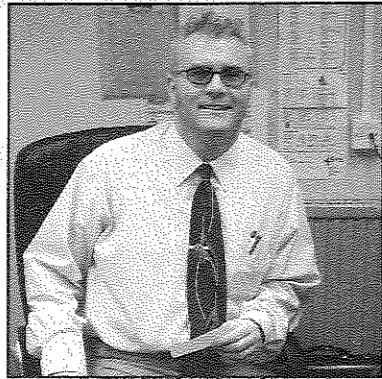

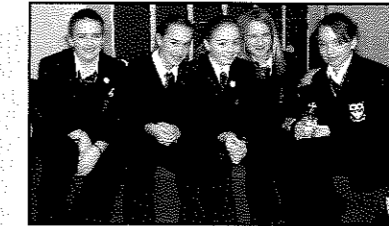

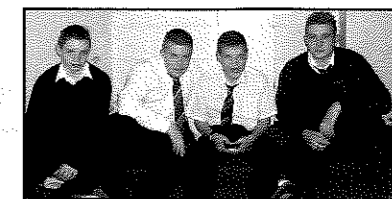
1st Year

2nd Year

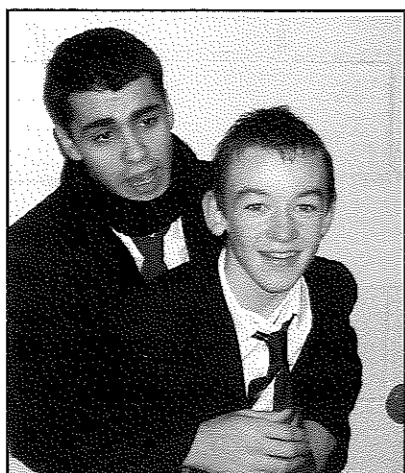

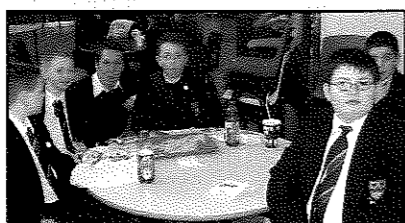
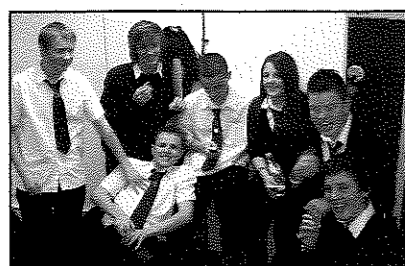


There was a visit to outward bound for lot of people, mingling with other schools, only with two things in mind; love or hassle.

4th Year

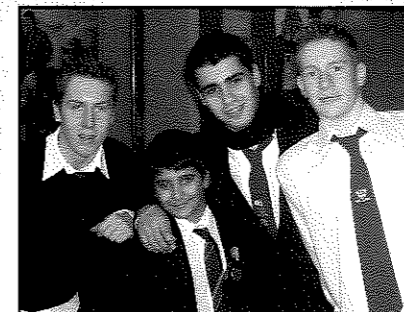
