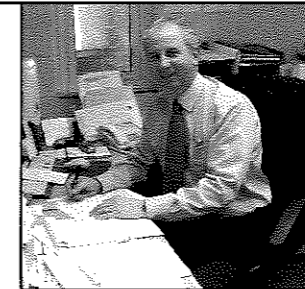
I wish all of you success and happiness for the future in whatever field of study or work you find yourself. I am sure that you will be successful and able to make a valuable contribution to your communities.

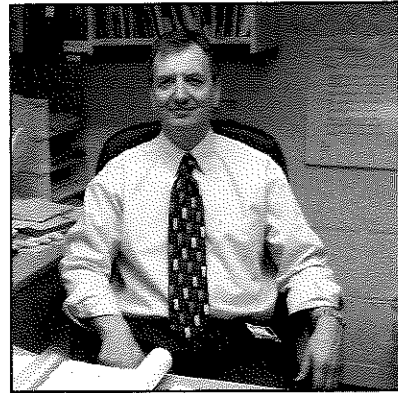

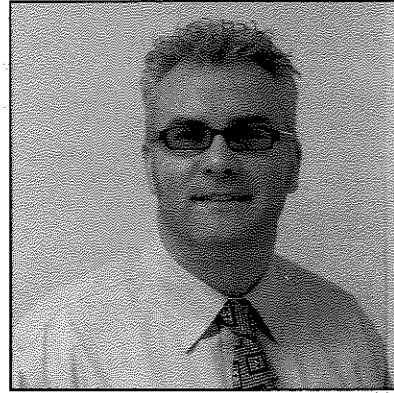

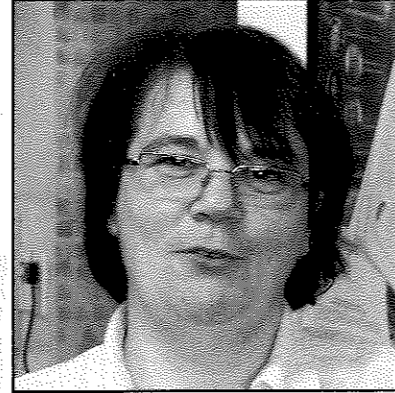

Buckle up and hold on tight as we take you the ride of your life. Six years that past so quickly but with memories to last a lifetime!

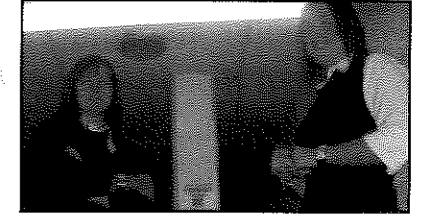

This was a fantastic group. We all had a fabulous time. All the pupils were a credit to themselves, their families and the school.

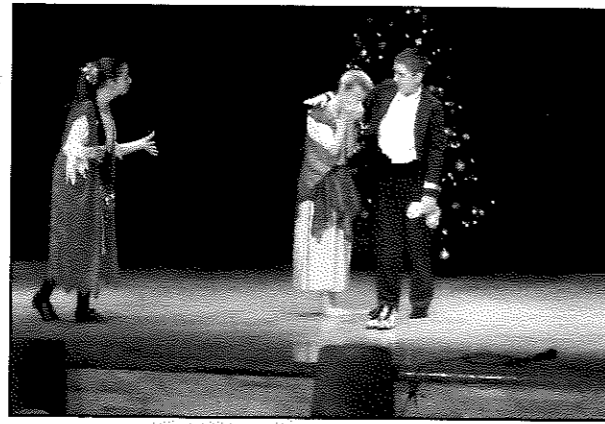
