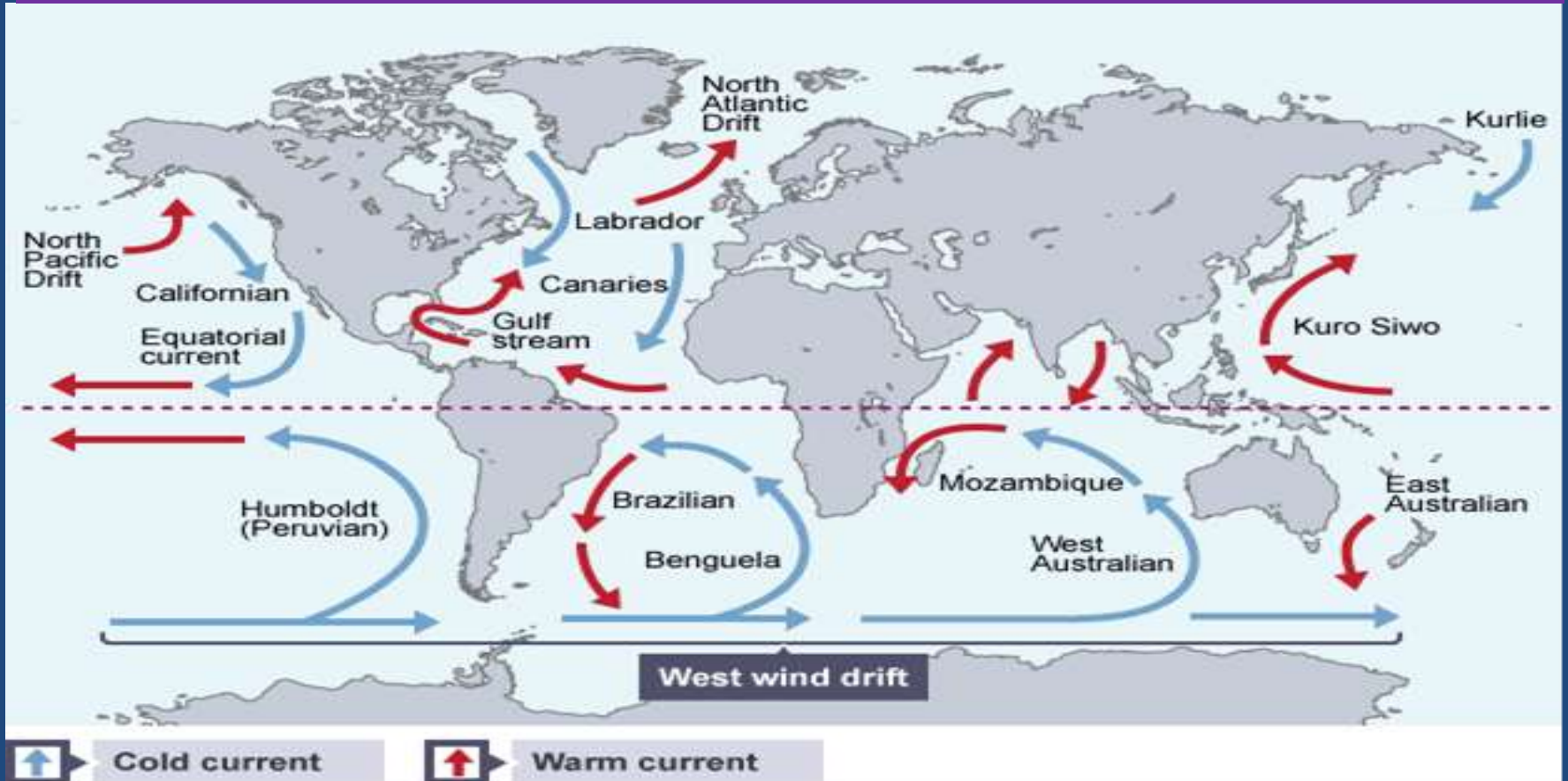

# Starter: Oceans by Size

- Put the oceans into the correct order by size, starting with the biggest:
- Answers:
- Pacific - 168,723,000 km<sup>2</sup>
- Atlantic - 85,133,000 km<sup>2</sup>
- Indian - 70,560,000 km<sup>2</sup>
- Southern - 21,960,000 km<sup>2</sup>
- Arctic - 15,558,000 km<sup>2</sup>

# The Incredible Edible Polyp

- Clean your hands and the desk
- Take one biscuit each and place it on your desk
- Take 1 lace each and break it into pieces
