Course Outline

- In National 5 you will have to pass:
- Spoken Language unit (talking and listening)
- submit a writing folio to the SQA and
- sit an exam

• In N5, you MUST pass the prelim in order to sit the exam.

Internally assessed units

- Spoken Language
- This is a combined talking and listening unit.
 This is marked as Achieved/ Not Achieved

Folio of Writing (externally marked, 30%)

- 2 pieces of writing:
- 1 x Creative piece (personal or imaginative)
- 1 x Discursive piece (your choice of topic)

This will be submitted early March to the SQA to mark.

The EXAM! (2 papers, worth 70%)

 Reading for Understanding, Analysis and Evaluation (30 marks, 1 hour)

- Critical Reading (40 marks, 1 and a half hours)
- Section 1: Questions on 1 Scottish set text (20 marks)
- Section 2: 1 Critical essay (20 marks)



Section1- Scottish Set Texts

 We will study either one novel OR one play or six short stories OR six poems from the Scottish set list.

 You will also need to know these texts wellyou'll answer questions on them in the exam.
 QUOTES will be needed.

Section 2 -Critical Essay

 The exam will ask you to write a critical essay on a text you have studied throughout the year- for example, Macbeth, Dulce et Decorum Est etc.


 You will not know what the question will focus on though! It could be characterisation, theme, setting... You need to know your text and your quotes very well!

What will be covered in National 5?

You will study a number of texts in class from a range of genres and work on the following tasks:

- Close Reading
- Textual Analysis
- Critical Essays
- Personal Writing
- Short Stories
- Discursive Writing
- Solo Talk
- Group Discussion
- Critical Listening

 on in class will have a purpose and will benefit you.



Do you get to take the National 5 exam if you have failed the internal assessments?

 There would be no point in sitting the exam if you have failed these, but you would have your National 4 qualification to fall back on.

 The Added Value Unit you completed in S3 will be vital to gaining a Nat4 qualification.

Support

- Supported Study/ Folio drop in sessions will run frequently throughout the term
- It is suggested that you attend these whenever you can- it makes a difference
- Folio- You have most of the year to create two written pieces. *PUT THE EFFORT IN-* you have more than enough time to create very good pieces of work. This counts for 30 of your marks.
