Health and Safety

Once again I wish to thank all of you who continue to follow our very important health and safety measures to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all children and staff.

I will continue to include reminders in our monthly newsletters for as long as these measures remain in place, as we all must remain very aware of the negative impact that any potential COVID cluster could have on our community; both in terms of the impact on health and on schooling.

Reminders again include:

- All adults must adhere to physical distancing at our school gates.
- Where physical distancing amongst adults is not possible then face coverings should be worn.
- Please stand clear of our gates at all times to allow children the space they need to enter and exit school.
- Park away from the school where possible.
- No cars should be driven directly past our school gates (with particular attention paid to the Church gate) during times when children are entering or exiting the school grounds. I cannot stress enough the dangers of not adhering to this important safety measure.
- Once your child has entered our school grounds they are supervised by staff, therefore parents are **not required** to wait until the school bell rings.
- Please do not park on yellow zig zag lines at our main entrance.
- Please do not park on areas marked 'keep clear' at Crown Street gate.
- Please be mindful of our neighbours when deciding where to park your car

Your support in these essential matters are vital in ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all. Please ensure family members involved in dropping off/collecting your child are fully aware of the above health and safety measures.

Allergies

A reminder that we continue to be a 'nut free zone'. We have children in our school with severe nut allergies therefore, to ensure the safety of all children, our school is a nut free zone. Please also note that we cannot accept birthday cakes being brought into school.

Absence/Sickness

Our August newsletter provided detailed information regarding absence/sickness. Please refer to this information if you are unsure of what to do. All our newsletters are added to our school blog:

However, I ask again that you ensure you follow the guidance below in relation to coronavirus.

Anyone with symptoms, or who has had contact with someone with symptoms, should not attend school. If in school at the time they will be asked to return home and be tested or, if you do not wish to carry out a test, isolate for 10 days.

The symptomatic person should remain at home and everyone in the household should self-isolate until they receive their test results. If the test is positive, they must isolate for 10 days and those in the household for 14 days.

The most common symptoms are:

- New, continuous cough
- Fever/high temperature
- Loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste

Please do not send your child to school if showing any of the above symptoms.

Please phone the office to advise staff if your child is going to be absent from school and if the absence is related to any of the above symptoms. If a test takes place then please advise the office of the results, positive or negative, as soon as possible.



P.E. Kit/Personal Belongings

In line with government guidelines, your child will receive physical education in an outdoor setting. If the weather forecast is heavy rain, high winds etc then PE will take place within an indoor setting with a focus on health and wellbeing, gentle yoga and/or mindfulness techniques.

To ensure the children are comfortable during outdoor PE they should wear their outdoor PE kit to school on their allocated PE day. This should consist of dark coloured jogging trousers/leggings, tshirt (no football tops), trainers and school jumper/cardigan. Children should also come to school with a warm, waterproof jacket.

Please remember that children should **not** bring any personal belongings such as toys, game cards, mobile phones etc to school.









Homework/Reading Books

Primary 2 to Primary 7 have now been issued with reading books. Each class teacher will advise of when your child's reading book should be returned. Your child's reading book need only be brought back on the day it is due to be returned and should not be brought back and forth.

Further homework will commence week beginning Monday 14th September. The format for homework will be a grid similar to the one used online during school closure. A paper copy of the grid will be given to each child and an electronic copy will be T Microsoft Teams uploaded to your child's class team on Microsoft Teams. Children will be able to add and/or upload homework privately online. Staff are supporting all children in ensuring they can access their class team online using their Glow login and are able to add work, and will continue to provide support in school to ensure everyone is able to access this.

Please note that our younger children, particularly Primary 1, will initially be issued with homework workbooks to cover a block of homework.

A survey will be issued this week regarding access to online learning. It would be very helpful to get as many responses as possible before our online homework begins.
