Safeguarding in the Online World- Safer Internet Day- 6th February 2018

I wanted to make you aware that I have become increasingly concerned about the level of safeguarding in place to support and protect children in Primaries 6 and 7 in the online world. In particular, I am concerned about content that is being created and shared on Instagram or viewed on Youtube and I would urge all parents to monitor this very closely.

Most of us have a range of devices at home and access to the online world is very easy. It is wonderful to see how well children embrace and adapt to new technology, but we must ensure that they are safe.

I would ask you to speak with your child to learn more about how, who and when they are communicating. We have worked with children in Primaries 6 and 7 to explore issues around gaming, instant messaging, social media and cyberbullying. However, there are some issues causing concern.

School Office (Reminder)

As part of North Lanarkshire Council's approved savings, we have had a reduction in the number of clerical hours allocated to the school. The office will be staffed each day from 8.30am-3.30pm. Traffic Around the Campus

We continue to remind everyone to follow parking restrictions when dropping off and collecting their children from school. We ask that all parents/carers and road users take the utmost care when driving and parking around the school grounds to ensure the safety of our pupils. Please <u>do not</u> double park at the drop off point or park in the turning circle, this area is for school buses only. These measures are very important and necessary to ensure the safety of all service users.

There are three designated disabled parking spaces in the car park. Please remember that parking in disabled parking bays is only permissible if you hold a blue badge.

It has been brought to my attention that some vehicles around the campus are engine idling. Please can I respectfully ask you to turn your engines off to reduce the effects of pollution to the environment and more importantly our children. Thank you for your support.

Attendance Matters

As you are aware Scottish Government has set **98%** attendance as a target for all children in Scottish Schools. Our school recorded the following statistics for week ending 12th January 2018. Regular attendance at school is vital to ensure continued progress in learning.

In Primary 1 almost all children attended school. (99%)

In Primary 2 almost all children attended school. (98%)

In Primary 3 almost all children attended school. (98%)

In Primary 4 almost all children attended school. (96%)

In Primary 5 almost all children attended school. (95%)

In Primary 6 almost all children attended school. (96%)

In Primary 7 almost all children attended school. (95%)



We continue to encourage children to attend school every day and to arrive on time. I would also ask you to make contact with us if your child is absent from school.

Sickness

Just a reminder that in accordance with the public health guidelines, children with diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms should be excluded until they have NO symptoms for 48 hours after an episode of diarrhoea/and/or vomiting. We recognise that children can often feel well within themselves long before they are symptom free for 48 hours, however they can remain infectious to others. We would be extremely grateful for your support to try and reduce the number of instances of infection / reinfection and best protect the health and wellbeing of all children and staff by observing the appropriate exclusion period if your child is unwell.
