# <u>P.E KIT</u>

## **ATTENDANCE MATTERS**

Good attendance is vital to ensure continued progress in learning. Please ensure that your child attends school whenever possible and if your child does need to be absent, please let us know. Our school recorded the following statistics for **week ending 29<sup>th</sup> November 2019**.

We continue to encourage children to attend school every day and to arrive on time. I would appeal to you to help your child to develop the habit of regular attendance and good time keeping.





### PARENT COUNCIL MATTERS

### **BREAKFAST CLUB**

May we remind you that breakfast club is every school day morning from 8.15am until 8.45am. Children can only come into the school grounds before 8.30am if they are attending Breakfast Club. General supervision is offered in the playground from 8.45am until the bell at 9am.

#### **REGISTRATION OF INFANT BEGINNERS 2020/21**

Children who attain the age of 5 years between 1 March 2020 and 28 February 2021 should be registered for education during week commencing 13<sup>th</sup> January 2020. The designated times for registration are: **Monday 13<sup>th</sup> –Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup>** 9.30-11.30am and 1.30-2.30pm **and Friday 17<sup>th</sup>** 9.30-11.30am and 1.30-2.30pm. **Please note that you must bring your child's birth certificate and current council tax notice with you.** 

Information for parents about the enrolment of children in schools and details of any placing request procedures, including early entrant requests may be obtained from the school. Parents who wish to defer entry for their child to Primary School and wish to apply for an additional year of part time pre-school education should register their child for school as described above and complete the deferred entry application form. Parents may access a booklet entitled 'Choosing a School' from the Scottish Government's website: www.scotland.gov.uk/Publications/2010/11/10093528/0.

We need to know the number of children joining us as soon as possible so that the staffing levels for next year can be calculated. Please help us by spreading the word so that our numbers are accurate at this early stage.

### TRANSFER OF PUPILS TO SECONDARY EDUCATION

Application forms for secondary education have been issued to all Primary 7 pupils. Parents who decide to make a placing request should send form PC 1(a) direct to Michelle Mullen, Contracts Section, Education and Families, Municipal Buildings, Kildonan Street, Coatbridge, ML5 3BT. Please return completed form (PC3 attachment) to the school as soon as possible.

### FREE NURSERY PLACES

Will your child be 3 before 1 March 2021? If so, you should apply for a nursery place. All 3-5 year olds are entitled to this service. Details of services and application forms can be obtained from any council nursery or council approved independent nursery or by contacting **01236 812281.** 

### SCHOOL LUNCHES

As you will be aware, children are no longer able to purchase cartons of juice with their school lunch. They are offered milk or tap water. This is an authority wide decision. Children can however bring in a carton of juice to have with their lunch if they wish.

### ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS WEEK 25th - 29th NOVEMBER 2019

Thank you to Mrs. Kiernan, and our fantastic team of Junior Road Safety Officers for organising a number of activities to raise awareness of road safety issues.

### WET WEATHER ARRANGEMENTS

Our playground is supervised from 8.45am and this is also the time children would be taken indoors, in the event of inclement weather. At breaks and lunch, if the weather is poor, children are also kept in, but it should be stressed that we do like the children to get some fresh air and request that children are wearing appropriate clothing. If inside during intervals, and lunch, all classes have monitors and staff supervise the children.

### SCHOOL GATES

The area around the school gates can become very busy at the beginning and end of the school day. We kindly ask that parents and carers who are dropping off or collecting their children, ensure that they leave a path for children to come in and out through the gate safely. For the security of all children we ask that no unauthorised adults enter the playground.

## PARKING

Parking continues to remain a difficult issue for our school. I would urge you to put the safety of our children first. Please avoid parking in the turning circle or disabled spaces (unless you have a badge), and please do not double park around the campus. There should always be free access for emergency vehicles at all times. In anticipation of your full support and co-operation, thank you.

### **MEDICATION**

Any pupil who requires medication must have the appropriate paperwork completed before the medication can be administered in school. All medicines must be in date and properly labelled with the child's name and pharmacy instructions. Parents are reminded of the importance of ensuring their child's medication is in date and is made available to the school.

#### **SICKNESS**

Just a reminder that in accordance with the public health guidelines, children with diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms should be excluded until they have <u>NO</u> symptoms for <u>48 hours</u> after an episode of diarrhoea/and/or vomiting. We recognise that children can often feel well within themselves long before they are symptom free for 48 hours, however they can remain infectious to others. We would be extremely grateful for your support to try and reduce the number of instances of infection / re-infection and best protect the health and wellbeing of all children and staff by observing the appropriate exclusion period if your child is unwell.

### HEAD LICE

Please remember to check your child's head on a regular basis for any signs of infection. It is no longer the role of the school nurse to do this. The school can no longer inform parents of any outbreaks of head lice. Advice given by the school nurse is that checks should be made on a weekly/fortnightly basis. If a child has head lice, they should be treated before returning to school. Please seek advice from your local Pharmacist or G.P about which treatments are most effective.
