












## Early Level (Primary 1) Literacy Home Activities

<p>Read the words in your 'spell box' so that you become really quick.</p> 	<p>Can you spot your common words in books and around the house?</p> 	<p>Share a story with a grown up. Spot the title and author. Talk about characters and answer questions about who, what, when, why?</p> 	<p>Can you re-tell the story by talking about the beginning, middle and end.</p> 
<p>Write your letters using different materials – pens, crayons, paint, gel pens etc.</p> 	<p>How many words can you say beginning with a sound?</p> 	<p>Cut out individual letters and try to build words using those letters. I can make lots of words with the letters below.</p> 	<p>Get your adult to say individual sounds and see if you can hear and say the word e.g. <b>p-o-t = ?</b></p> 
<p>Make snap cards with your words and letters and have a game. Who will win?</p> 	<p>Make your own books and stories. You could be the author and illustrator.</p> 	<p>Try some of these Apps for letter formations.</p> <p><i>Dexterity VPP – Write It</i>  <i>Eye/Brain Training – Form</i>  <i>Constasy</i>  <i>Little Writer</i></p> 	<p>Why not try: 'Teach Your Monster to Read' on the computer.</p>
