You may be entitled to apply for free schools meals if your child attends a North Lanarkshire school. All Primary 1 to 3 children are automatically entitled to receive a free school meal.

# **Eligibility**

If you receive any of the following benefits and your child attends a North Lanarkshire school then you can apply for free school meals:

- ✓ Income support
- ✓ Job seekers allowance (income based)
- ✓ Employment and support allowance (income related)
- ✓ Universal credit (max. monthly income of £610)
- Child tax credit (gross annual income less than £16,105 and no element of working tax credit)
- ✓ In receipt of both maximum child tax credit and maximum working tax credit (gross maximum income below £7330)
- ✓ Support under part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

### Did you know...?

You may be entitled to apply for an essential clothing grant if your child attends a North Lanarkshire school.

# Applying for a clothing grant

To apply, please download and complete an application form below (address details are on the form).

Once the council has made a decision, they will contact you using the mobile number or email address you supplied, or by letter.

You can submit an application at any time throughout the school year. They are usually processed within two weeks.

Please include children who will be 16 years of age between 1 March and 30 September (children of school leaving age) on your form.

# **Eligibility**

If you receive any of the following benefits and your child attends a North Lanarkshire school then can apply for a clothing grant:

- ✓ Income support
- ✓ Job seekers allowance (income based)
- ✓ Employment and support allowance (income related)
- ✓ Universal credit (maximum monthly income of £610)
- ✓ Housing benefit
- ✓ Council tax reduction (council tax discount or exemption does not apply)

# **Payments**

Clothing grant payments of £110 per child are paid directly into a bank/building society account. We will make the payment when the school has confirmed that the pupil has return to school.

One clothing grant will be paid for any pupil during a school year.

Our breakfast club provides an excellent start to the school day.

### NLC Breakfast clubs aim to:

- ✓ provide a healthy nutritious meal
- √ help children to be alert and ready to learn
- ✓ encourage children to mix with their friends
- ✓ improve attendance and performance throughout the day
- ✓ reassure parents that their child is safe when dropped off in the morning.

All primary schools in North Lanarkshire operate a Breakfast club.

The opening times range from 8.15am until 8.50am and operate at the discretion of the

Head Teacher.

The breakfast consists of cereal, milk and toast. This is free to pupils who are in Primary 1

to 3 and for pupils in Primary 4 to 7 who receive free school meals. For all other pupils the

cost is £1 per day with a sliding scale for families of two at £1.50 per day and families of

three at £1.80 per day.

Did you know....?

Club 365 is a programme that offers hot lunches and activities at weekends and holidays.

**Club 365** 

Club 365 programme which provides hot lunches and activities at weekends and holidays

has not been able to take place as normal this year due to the pandemic.

With Covid-19 restrictions continuing to impact Club 365 provision, and based on the

success of the voucher scheme, parents of primary pupils who, under revenue and benefits

criteria are eligible for free school meals will now receive a voucher every four weeks.

Payments will be made automatically on a four-weekly basis using the same mobile phone

text/ paypoint approach. Eligible parents/ carers will receive a voucher of approximately

£19.44 per child to cover weekend lunch costs. This payment will be higher during holiday

periods.

The new voucher payment system will begin week commencing 21 September. Vouchers

can be redeemed by being cashed and then spent on food at any shop, which has
