

1. Photographs

Use photographs to create interest for your child and talk to them about who and what is going on. Tell them stories about what was happening when it was taken.

2. Guess the object

Cut a hole in a box that is large enough for their hands. Make sure that they understand that they're not allowed to peek into the hole. Place an object in the box. Have the child describe what the object feels like.

3. Treasure Hunt

Hide objects around your house and use verbal language, symbols or sign to encourage your child to try and find them.

4. Telephone Chat

Use a real or pretend telephone and begin a conversation then pass the phone to your child. Even if their language is not following yours go with their lead!

5. Role Play

For example, set out some objects and create a pretend shop. Wait until your child asks for an item in whatever way they communicate and role play taking their money, giving them change etc.
