Building Skills in Close Reading

The following questions can be used to help you build your skills in understanding, analysing and evaluating text. Choose a feature article from a broadsheet newspaper and try to answer the questions below.

Understanding

- 1. Summarise the ideas of the text, using extended bullet points. You might find it useful to write a sentence summarising each paragraph.
- 2. What was the overall, key idea of the passage? Write it down in one sentence.

Analysis

- 3. Pick out two places where the writer used word choice to achieve a particular effects. Focus on single words and think about the words' connotations, rather than simply what they mean.
- 4. Pick out one place where the writer used imagery effectively. Explain how the image was used and why it was effective.
- 5. Pick out one place where the writer used sentence structure effectively. Identify the feature of sentence structure and explain why it was effective.
- 6. How would you describe the tone of this article? How is the tone created?
- 7. Did the writer use any other techniques to achieve a particular impact? If so, explain which techniques were used and why.

Evaluation

- 8. How effective is the final paragraph as a conclusion to the article as a whole?
- 9. How effective has the writer been in conveying their point(s) in this article? Support your answer with reference to the text where appropriate.
