June provided many opportunities for all types of talent to be showcased within Greenfaulds. The faculty of performing arts participated in their showcase tour around all six of our cluster primary schools to give pupils a flavour of the opportunities open to them when they move to high school.

The Dance Show on 6 June was a sellout performance for our talented and enthusiastic dancers to demonstrate their ability and show a wider audience why they consistently win the North Lanarkshire Schools Dance competition each year!

For the first time in the school's history, an evening of Jazz was hosted by the Parent Council, with singing and playing provided by our school Jazz Band, ably led by Mr Smyth. The evening didn't disappoint with a wealth of talent in a cabaret style setting. A definite repeat for next year's calendar!

The final week of term saw the recent frenzy of school show preparations pay off as pupils performed Hairspray the musical to sell out audiences for a 3-night run. The wealth of talent on display was humbling – singing; dancing; choreography; professionalism and enthusiasm second to none.

A huge thanks is due to all of the pupils and staff for delivering such a demanding repertoire in a busy month. We very much look forward to the successes being repeated next session.

### New Mosaics to decorate the entrance

2017 is the year of History, Heritage and Archaeology and the Art and Design Department at GHS have been successful with a heritage lottery fund bid for Stories, Stones and Bones sharing heritage funding. The amount of the bid is £10,000.

The Art & Design project is called 'A Sense of Place: The Roman Presence in Cumbernauld' and the key local heritage sites are Bar Hill Roman Fort and the Antonine Wall. The Art & Design department are looking forward to taking pupils on trips to see the Roman fort and Antonine Wall, as well as Roman artefacts in collections at the Hunterian Museum and the National Museum of Scotland. A main part of the project will involve S1-S3 pupils creating a series of large mosaics with the Scottish artist Alan Potter (for display at GHS).

Pupils will also be working with Scottish artist Kate Leiper to create illustrations for an illustrated brochure about the heritage sites and the Roman presence in Cumbernauld. The grant will also provide materials for Roman-themed printmaking, illustration and pottery activities for hundreds of S1-S6 pupils at GHS, and staff and pupils at GHS are also looking forward to creating some artworks with pupils at Redburn School. Everyone is excited about showcasing the project at the local

Cumbernauld Museum and in special exhibitions at GHS throughout the next year, engaging the local community with their heritage.

#### Parent Council

This has been a very busy year for the Parent Council. Meetings have been very well attended each month, and in addition to learning more about current developments within education, the Council has also found time for fundraising ventures. Recently, a presentation of £6000 was made to the school which has allowed us to enhance the pupild communication system within the school by the installation of new multi-media display screens within the School Social Area. Pupils and staff would like to extend a massive 'thank you' to the Parent Council for their effort and support of the school.

### Citizenship in Action

Following the successful Youth Philanthopist Initiative (YPI) competition held for 2<sup>nd</sup> year pupils, there have been a number of very successful outcomes for local charities and organisations. The YPI competition has now become established in Greenfaulds as a means of engaging young people in their local community by learning about charities and community groups. Each of the groups taking part must find out about their chosen charity, prepare a presentation to peers and then present to a panel of adjudicators. The winning group then 'earns' a £3000 donation (from the YPI group) for their chosen charity. This year's winners were **Strathcarron Hospice**, championed by

Part of the impact of pupil involvement in such an event has meant a raised awareness of the role charity groups and voluntary organisations play within our local community. As a result of this, pupils asked if it would be possible to hold a non-uniform day on Monday 26 June to support donations for the local food bank and also donations of uniform for the Cumbernauld/Kilsyth Care – our local school uniform bank.
