Regular exposure to French will help you improve not only your performance in French Listening exams but also in Speaking, Reading and Writing. Listening to or reading a little bit of French for a short while (even just 5-10 minutes) several times per week will get you used to the way the language sounds, the way sentences are constructed and the way it is spoken/written by 'real' French speakers. Whichever ones you listen to or read, don't get frustrated if you don't understand everything. The important thing is just to 'absorb' as much of the language as possible.
