



For (a) iii Design Principles

Proximity

Grouping like objects and separating unlike elements is using proximity in design to show relationships and importance. If items are related to each other, group them into closer proximity. Separate items that are not directly related to each other, vary the space between to indicate the closeness or the importance of the relationship.



By putting the title and subtitle close to each other, we now have one well-defined unit rather than six apparently unrelated units. It is now clear that those two topics are closely related to each other.

By moving the byline and date farther away, it becomes instantly clear that although this is related information and possibly important, it is not part of the title
