
Occupational safety and wellbeing update

Managing asbestos in buildings

Further to visits by the Health and Safety Executive to three schools, North Lanarkshire Council is making improvements to its asbestos management arrangements. As part of this improvement programme, all Head Teachers, Deputy Head Teachers and Heads of Establishment must complete the online Asbestos Awareness e-learning module by no later than the end of the academic year 2022/23.

Not all premises have asbestos containing materials present, and not all Head Teachers and others will have management of asbestos as part of their current remit. However, it is foreseeable that Head Teachers and others may move premises or take management responsibility for other premises, either on a temporary or permanent basis. Completing the Asbestos Awareness module will ensure that where management of asbestos is, or becomes, part of a manager's remit, they have an awareness of the risks to health associated with asbestos and the requirement to manage asbestos in buildings. This awareness will assist managers in understanding and implementing the specific asbestos management arrangements in place at premises under their control.

You are being invited to take part in a research study about neurodevelopment in children. Before you decide if you want to take part, it is important for you to understand why the research is being done and what it will involve. Please take time to read the information on this page carefully and discuss it with others if you wish. Ask the researchers if there is anything that is not clear or if you would like more information. Take time to decide whether or not you wish to take part.

I hope that this sheet will answer any questions you have about the study.

This study aims to gather information from primary teachers and early years educators with regards to their experience with neurodevelopmental (ND) differences in the classroom in Scottish schools. The survey will ask about your professional training in identifying and teaching children with neurodevelopmental differences. The project will then explore your experience and confidence identifying and teaching children with neurodevelopmental differences. The project also aims to understand the process beginning with identifying a neurodevelopmental difference through to referral to relevant parties for a neurodevelopmental diagnosis, from the perspective of you, as teachers.

You are receiving this invitation as a primary teacher or early years educator in Scotland or as a student on your Masters programme at the School of Education, University of Glasgow. This invitation has been sent to everyone in these groups.

Your participation in this research is voluntary and you have the right to withdraw at any point. If you wish to withdraw, please contact the principal investigator at the email above and your data will be removed from the study.

Should you choose to take part, the study will be conducted as an online survey on the University of Glasgow approved Qualtrics XM platform which can be accessed through an email link. The survey will take approximately 20 minutes to answer. At the end of the survey you will be asked to provide an email address. This will only be used should the study responses cause any concern for the welfare of a child or young person, or the participant.

This email address will also be used to share the results of this research, facilitate withdrawal from the project or to contact you about future research studies by this team, should you wish. If you choose to be contacted about future research studies, your email address will be retained by the project supervisors on a secure server for five years.

It is possible that you may experience some distress recalling experiences which are asked about in this survey. As a result, the survey does not ask any questions about specific details but rather for general themes. If you experience any distress, please contact the principal investigator. This will be discussed with the project supervisors, who can direct you to appropriate sources of support.

Your responses to this survey are confidential. An ID number will be allocated to preserve anonymity during analysis of the results. Your email address will be stored separately to the survey responses. Please note that assurances on confidentiality will be strictly adhered to unless evidence of wrongdoing or potential harm is uncovered. In such cases the University may be obliged to contact relevant statutory bodies/agencies.

Involvement in the study will not affect your grades in your masters degree programme or employment.

The results of the study will be used to produce an article. This will be submitted for publication and conference presentation. The data will be stored electronically at the University of Glasgow for ten years and will not be re-used by the University of Glasgow in the future.

This study has been reviewed and agreed by the School of Education Ethics Forum, University of Glasgow.

Your Personal Data

The University of Glasgow will be what's known as the 'Data Controller' of your personal data processed in relation to your participation in the research project: Neurodevelopmental differences in early years education: an exploration of educators' experience identifying and teaching children with neurodevelopmental differences.

This privacy notice will explain how The University of Glasgow will process your personal data.

Why we need it

We are collecting basic personal data such as your name and contact details in order to conduct our research. We need your name and contact details to flag any concerns should the study responses cause any concern for the welfare of a child or young person, or you as the participant. The contact details will also be used to notify you of the findings of the research and can be used to facilitate the withdrawal of your data from the study. You may also indicate during this study if you wish to be contacted about future research studies conducted by this team and in this case your email address will be retained to facilitate finding participants for future research about teaching and neurodevelopment.

We only collect data that we need for the research project. Your email address will be stored separately from your survey responses. An ID number will be assigned to your survey responses to anonymise them. This ID number will also be stored with your email address so that the anonymisation can be reversed if this is indicated to raise concerns or aid your withdrawal of data from the study. All of your data will be stored electronically on a secure server.

Legal basis for processing your data

What we do with it and who we share it with

In addition, security measures are in place to ensure that your personal data remains safe. Your personal data will be stored on the secure University of Glasgow server and accessed from desktop computers in the University of Glasgow which are encrypted and in a secure physical environment.

What are your rights?*

This project has been ethically approved via the College of Social Sciences Research Ethics Committee or relevant School Ethics Forum in the College.

How long do we keep it for?

Your **personal** data will be retained by the University only for as long as is necessary for processing and no longer than the period of ethical approval 30/06/2023. After this time, personal data will be securely deleted. Email addresses will be deleted at the end of the project or stored for 5 years.
