Rights Respecting Schools

As you are aware, we are a Silver: Rights Aware school and we are working towards Gold: Rights Respecting status. We are embedding children's rights within our practice. As part of this, we focus on 2 Articles from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child each month. This month our focus has been on:

Article 27: I have the right to have a proper house, food and clothing



Article 42: Everyone should learn about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child
