Learning in nursery: We have been very busy in in all areas of the nursery watching Dr. Claire Warden telling us all about Rocks, Stones and Crystals and have followed her ideas outdoors and indoors. Some of our experiences included collecting stones and rocks, washing, and painting them. We learned all about transient art and now know we do not need glue to create a fabulous picture.

We explored science as we mixed up different chemicals, (wash up liquid, cream of tartar and vinegar) and poured it into the volcano and saw it erupt! We have been building towers and designing buildings.

We investigated a very old fossil thousands of years old with patterns on the sides.

We were learning literacy through listening, talking, and drawing, sharing our thoughts and ideas.

Numeracy was everywhere! We looked at patterns and shape, we counted the stones we found, we used positional language to line up the stones, first next, beside, and last.

We have also been learning a lot about the season and the changes in the weather and leaves. We see the wind, feel the rain, and know it's Autumn.
