Staff training:

Staff training is essential and extremely important for the delivery of high quality care and learning for your children while attending nursery.

Staff have been very fortunate this year to have been involved in so many wonderful training experiences that they can use to support your child's interest and learning in nursery.

Our staff have enjoyed food hygiene, First aid, literacy in Three Read, including training for emotional understanding, and using the document Realising the Ambition.

Learning in nursery:

Learning is fun and individual to the child's interests and although we plan backdrop learning, it takes into consideration seasons, current events and the fundings based on observations staff discover from children's play.

Indoors and outdoors are both always busy with children trying new things, exploring, and investigating technology and construction.

We saw our children using their fine motor skills to glue, stick, cutting, using picks and Sellotape around the art room to connect objects. Children were using their imagination to create and their curiosity to apply their skills when designing.

We saw the children extending their creativity and imagination in role play, using the dressing up clothes, small world resources outdoors in the mud kitchen as well as playing with the basketball hoop, water, and bug hunting.

Numeracy was everywhere with children using vocabulary in positional language, understanding next, first, or last through turn taking and going to the canteen or gym hall.

Our learning included recalling new words for songs ready to perform for our Daffodil tea. Parents contributed by decorating eggs and hats at home.

Mobile phones:

Staff will ask you to turn your mobile phone off while you are in the playroom or nursery garden. Staff must follow North Lanarkshire Council guidance in this and due to all phones now having access to camera, using mobile phones is not permitted on any educational settings in NLC.

Please Park in the car park across from the nursery entrance. The school gate must be KEPT CLEAR AT ALL TIMES.

Dogs:

Dogs are not permitted inside the nursery/school grounds. Please do not bring your fur baby into the grounds at any time.
