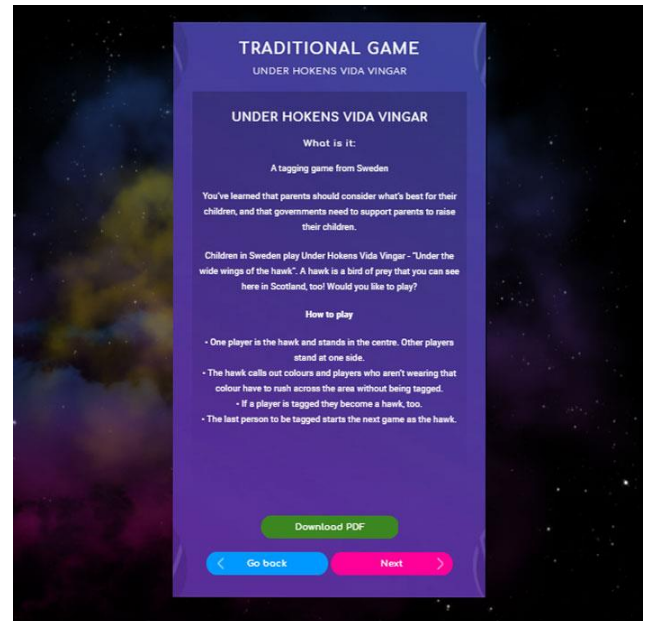
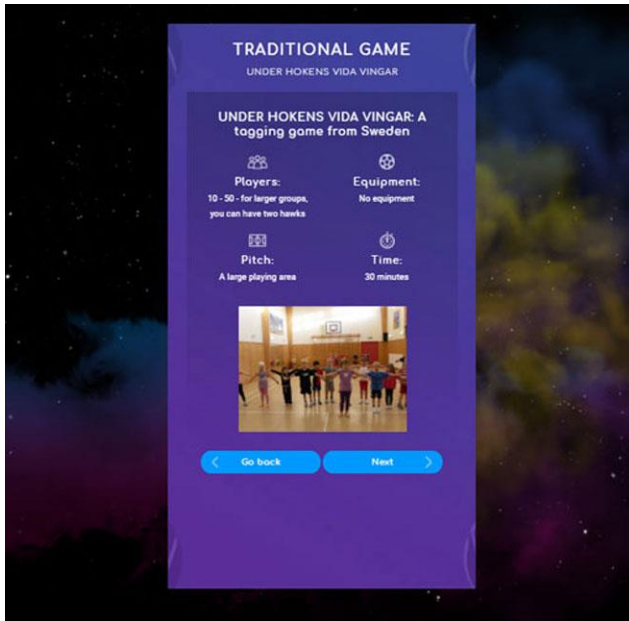
ABOUT CHILD RIGHTS LAUNCHPAD

Child Rights Launchpad is an award-winning, interactive resource developed by Unicef UK as part of their partnership with the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games. It helps children and young people to explore their rights under the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC).

THE COMPETITION TASK

Building on the incorporation of traditional games onto Child Rights Launchpad, we'd like to develop more opportunities within the resource for children to explore their rights within the context of physical activity.

For inspiration, you can see an example of what a Brazilian traditional game looks like attached to this pack, and on the website: <https://launchpad.unicef.org.uk/intro/> at **Level 2, Article 12** after the global quiz.



We're asking you to support your pupils to come up with a game that can be easily played in a playground, sports hall or classroom. The game should have the broad aim of helping other children to understand an individual article of the UNCRC or a rights-related concept such as 'participation', 'tolerance' or 'equality'.

There's a [template](#) on [pg. 3-5](#) that you can use as a guide but please do not feel confined to this. We want entries to be as creative as possible! We're happy to accept entries that are drawn, digitally created, hand written or any combination of the above. Entries should not be on anything larger than A3.

If you chose not to use the template, you must still fill in the [Competition Application Form](#) on [pg.6-8](#). Entries sent without filling out this form will not be accepted.

Winners will be chosen in the 3-7 years, 8-12 years and 13-18 years categories. We are asking each school for a [maximum of 5 entries](#), which can be in one or more of the available categories.

NB: *We understand that when working with younger children in the Level 1 category, that there will be more teacher input than at entries at Level 2 and 3.*

We encourage you to celebrate the work of all pupils who take part in the Competition, perhaps by running your own in-school celebration. This could include simply showcasing or playing the games in a relevant area of the school or could be a special event where parents and the wider school community are invited to view the works.
