IMPORTANT!!! NUT FREE ZONE!

As with all NLC schools, we are a **Nut Free Zone**. This is to protect staff and children who have **severe allergies**. Can I ask parents/ carers to continue to carefully check the packaging of snacks and packed lunch items coming into school and refrain from sending anything containing nuts. Important Information for Parents/Carers of Children Starting School in August 2026

If your child is due to start Primary 1 in August 2026 and you are considering deferring their entry, we would like to draw your attention to the North Lanarkshire Council (NLC) website, where you will find detailed information about the deferral process and eligibility criteria.

In the first instance, we kindly ask that you speak with the nursery team at your child's current early years establishment. They will be able to offer guidance and support in helping you make an informed decision.

Should you wish to proceed with a deferral request, please ensure that all relevant paperwork is completed and submitted to your child's current nursery by Friday 5th December 2025.

Please note: If you later decide to change your mind and wish your child to start school as originally planned, this can be revisited.

Improvement Journey Update

Supporting Our Children's Learning: A Focus on Questioning and Numeracy

Over the past few terms, our teaching staff have been working closely with colleagues across North Lanarkshire Council to deepen their understanding of effective questioning strategies. This work is designed to help children think more critically, engage more fully, and develop a stronger grasp of their learning.

To support this, teachers have been investing in their own professional development by reading research-based articles and applying new approaches in their classrooms. These strategies encourage children to explore ideas, explain their thinking, and build confidence in problem-solving.

Alongside this, we have been reviewing how we structure and deliver numeracy learning. Our teachers have attended training sessions and shared their learning with one another, ensuring that best practice is embedded across the school. We have also identified a range of high-quality resources that will help children develop a deeper understanding of key mathematical concepts.

We are excited about the positive impact these improvements will have on your child's learning journey and look forward to continuing to work together to support every child's success.

Improving Attendance - Our Ongoing Focus

At Holy Family Primary and Nursery Class we are committed to supporting every child in achieving their best, and one of the most important factors in this is regular attendance.
