Things are beginning to get started...



We will take on board parental comments and build any suggestions into our on-going improvements. The nursery has undergone a bit of an overhaul recently and it is lovely to see all the hard work of the staff has not gone unnoticed with many parents commenting on this.

Asthma

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that it is their responsibility to check that their child's inhaler is in good working order. School staff are able to support children with the administration of this medicine during the school day, but we are not responsible for ensuring it is in date etc. If you would like to check your child's medication, please pop into the school office, where a member of staff will be able to assist you.

Following discussions with medical professionals we would like to encourage more children to keep their inhalers in their bags and pockets. There are many reasons for this, including the fact that it is good practice, especially if this is likely to be medication that a child will need for a prolonged period of time. Another reason is that there are occasions when the office is unstaffed. If you decide your child is mature enough to keep their own inhaler, then you are welcome to keep an emergency one in the office. If this is the case, please let us know.

School Improvements


Any visitors to the school will have noticed our new kitchen server area, if you haven't seen it yet, it is beautiful and has made a huge difference to our lunchtime arrangements. We have slightly altered the



lunchtime arrangements with Rooms 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 coming into the dinner hall at 12.30. The children are then served in a rotation. Rooms 8, 9, 11 and 12 go outside first and come in at approximately 12.50. Again pupils are served in a rotation. All pupils are eating together whether they are having a packed lunch or a school dinner. Our school dinner uptake has increased as a result of the universal free school meals for P1 – 3 pupils. Remember our school dinners are freshly cooked on site.


Primary 5 Swimming
