Non-Uniform Day

This month our Non-Uniform Day will be held on Friday 5th February 2016, due to the above assembly. Pupils who wish to take part can pay £1 to wear their own clothes. Pupils not taking part MUST attend in their school uniform.

Breakfast Club

As of Monday 9th November our Breakfast Club is costing 20p per pupil. We are delighted to see more children using this service. Recent research strongly suggests that pupils who regularly have breakfast do better at school than those who don't. Breakfast club is operational daily from 8.15am until 8.45am. However, I am concerned with the increasing number of children who are arriving prior to 8.15am. There is no supervision in school or in the playground and pupils should **not** arrive before 8.15.

Rights, Respecting School

In order to raise awareness of Children's Rights, we will be talking about rights as well as respectful attitudes and responsible actions within assembly and school, to ensure our children help us create and maintain an ethos of dignity, which will allow our children to become responsible citizens with full

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access to their rights. We will also have a focus right. This will be communicated through our website as well as newsletters etc., we will be continuing with this right for the remainder of January and then the pupils will choose another one.

Article 28: (Right to education): All children have the right to a primary education, which should be free. Wealthy countries should help poorer countries achieve this right. Discipline in schools should respect children's dignity. For children to benefit from education, schools must be run in an orderly way – without the use of violence. Any form of school discipline should take into account the child's human dignity. Therefore, governments must ensure that school administrators review their discipline policies and eliminate any discipline practices involving physical or mental violence, abuse or neglect. The Convention places a high value on education. Young people should be encouraged to reach the highest level of education of which they are capable.
