- * Community Learning and Development worker to support identified families (1 day per week)

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As you will see we feel we have targeted a wide range of curricular areas in order to help us close the attainment gap. We will be consulting with parents during our Parental Consultations on how your allocation for session 2018/19 would be best spent.
