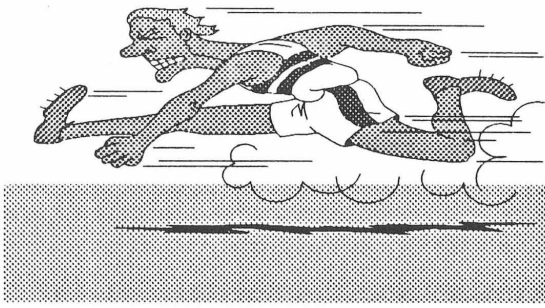
The track events included the hundred and two hundred metres and relays. There were also field events in the long jump and shot put. All event produced excitement and personal bests.

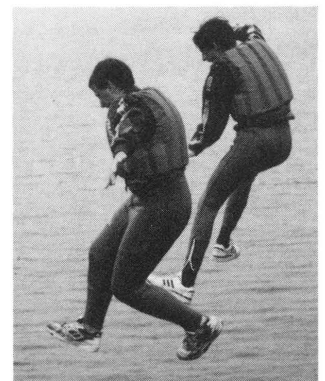
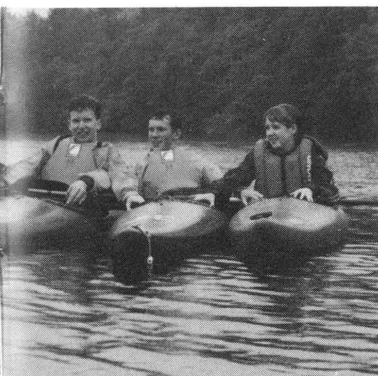


GALAVANTING AT GARELOCHHEAD

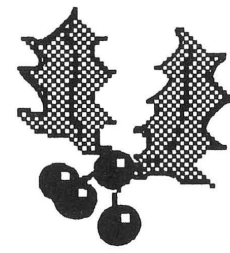

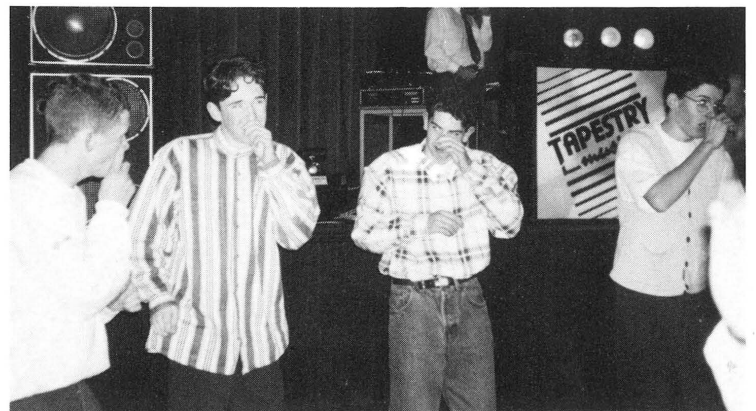
When all involved has recovered from their various aches and pains they admitted that the trip had been beneficial and extremely memorable.
