## Challenge Poverty Week!

This week there has been a national focus on challenging poverty this week and we have been doing our bit in school too. On Monday we visited Coatbridge Foodbank with nine bags of groceries, all collected through our Harvest donations. A further nine bags were also delivered to the residents of St James' Way on Tuesday. Thank you for every tin and packet handed in last week. As they say...every little helps! Remember the Foodbank is there throughout the year; whether you need a little bit of help yourself, or you are in a position to support them.

Food has remained a theme for us as we have looked at other ways we challenge poverty as a local authority. All pupils in P.1-3 and all pupils eligible for a free school meal are entitled to a **free** breakfast at our school **Breakfast Club** which runs from Monday to Friday every week. For all other pupils there is a daily charge of £1, with a sliding scale for families with more than one child. Mrs Stewart greets the pupils each morning at 8.15am in the dinner hall for food and games. No need to book, just come on the mornings that suit you. Also, remember that **Club 365** will operate every day we are on holiday next week. All pupils who are entitled to a free school meal will receive lunch and activities with no payment required.
