Annual Improvement Plan 2023/2024

Nursery Priority: Attainment in Tools for Writing will increase from 15% to 60% for those ON TRACK amongst the older learners. Amongst our younger pupils, the number ON TRACK will rise from 30% to 70%

- All learners provided with a range of quality experiences mark-making and developing fine motor skills.
- Talking Tips and Home-link bags will reflect the importance of fine motor skills and suggest ways this can be supported at home too.
- The natural outdoor environment will have an emphasis on these same priorities.
- Staff training will be geared towards quality teaching in this area.

Cluster Priority: Assessment & Moderation which informs teacher judgement.

- An Assessment & Moderation Lead will be appointed from each school to take this forward. Miss Rae has taken on this responsibility in Kirkshaws.
- Moderation of Assessment will be rolled out across the Coatbridge Cluster.
- A collaborative attendance project will aim to improve attendance and, as a result, raise attainment.

School Priority 1: Attendance & Engagement improved in learning across all stages, P.1-P.7, as evidenced in data from SEEMiS registration, OOSHL attendance and parental engagement.

- All staff will be trained in the Nurture Principals, working in partnership with Educational Psychology.
- Nurturing next steps applied.
- Seasons of Growth groups will be established.
- Outdoor Learning will be extended and developed.
- RRSA – Going for **Gold** accreditation as a Rights Respecting School.
- After school clubs reviewed and extended, including family learning opportunities.
- Pupil Voice opportunities extended.
- RSHP audit and parent focus groups established.
- Community links strengthened.

School Priority 2: Attainment in Reading will improve from a combined average of 75% TO 79% and in writing from 73% to 77% by June 2024. Attainment in Maths & Numeracy will increase from a combined average of 73% in June 2023 to 77% by June 2024.

- Curriculum Rationale refreshed.
- Building resilience and confidence through expressive arts.
- Reading Schools accreditation.
- Digital skills increased.
- Support for learning strengthened and extended.
- Collaborative planning and teaching with a focus on outdoors.
- Moderation of assessment, planning and daily tasks across a level.
