It has been wonderful to have our whole school community back under one roof again following the return of our senior pupils. Our new staggered entry and exit procedures have gone very well and we would like to thank our parental community for your cooperation and patience in supporting us to establish these new practices. Reporting to Parents

One of the things we are really missing this session is having parents through our doors and making them feel like a valuable part of our school community. These in person interactions help us to connect together and to get to know each other really well: we hope we can return to this in the not too distant future. Getting It Right For Me Plans (GIRFME)

During this meeting you can expect to hear a review of the plan and of your child's progress from the class teacher, and we will work in partnership with the class teacher, and a member of the management team, in setting new targets for the term ahead. We will also involve any other agencies where appropriate in this process.

Following the spring break teaching staff will begin the process of compiling your child's annual report. These reports will be shared with parents and carers in the first week of June 2021.

Transitions

Bellshill Academy has begun their transition work with our P7 pupils this week. We are delighted to be able to welcome Mr Nicholson, Principal Teacher of pupil support, to talk to our classes, and hope our parents can participate in the virtual parental meeting mid-week. Enhanced transition work has also been undertaken for children who require additional support. We will keep parents/carers for any child who is transferring to a secondary school other than Bellshill Academy informed of transition information.

Plans for transfer to S1, and to P1 will continually be adapted in light of any changes to government guidance and we will keep you informed of this as soon as we have any further information.

Tackling Poverty

Bellshill cluster has been working in partnership to produce a statement on removing the poverty barriers to education to ensure members of our community are included and achieve. Each school has then devised their own policy specific to their context in order to address this. The policy for the Bellshill cluster, and for Mossend PS and NC can be viewed via our school app, or our school website.

Promoting Positive Partnerships

Miss Watson has been responsible for working in partnership with many of our stakeholders this session. One of her priorities has been to ensure that pupil voice is promoted throughout our school community. Following a recent meetings with pupils, the children have requested that we introduce a monthly dress down day for staff and pupils in order to raise much needed donations for our school fund. On the last Friday of every month all pupils are invited to come to school dressed down, if possible a suggested £1 donation per family can be made towards our fund.

Parent Council Area

Our Parent Council has been working really hard to organise an Easter Egg Trail for Mossend children. The Team has devised a fun word search, but in order to get the words children will have to head to Hope Street Adventure Park and find the Eggs with the hidden words. All children will be issued with a copy of the word search on Thursday 2nd April.
