### **Children's Learning**

This month the children have been learning about dinosaurs and have enjoyed taking part in lots of interesting and challenging learning experiences. We have explored different types of dinosaurs and discovered that some eat meat and are carnivores, some eat plants and are herbivores, and some eat both and are called omnivores. The children went into the secret garden for a dinosaur hunt, they found lots of clues, footprints, and dinosaur eggs. We have made ice dinosaur eggs and used dinosaur models along with various construction toys, to create homes for them. The children have shown lots of interest in this topic and are able to talk about all the different names and most can sort them into sets of the same type.

The children have also had the opportunity to learn about 2d and 3d shapes. We have used them in our artwork and in maths learning experiences. We have also restarted our language groups where the children can listen and retell the stories in their own words, learn new vocabulary, learn nursery rhymes, and take part in the Sunnybank literacy program.

We have now also started using the balance and two-wheeler bikes. Already we have budding Chris Hoy's in our midst!

#### **Secret Garden**



- In severe weather, e.g. heavy ice and snow, then there will only be one access point to the school, which will be via the main gate.
- The school facilities staff are responsible for clearing a safe path through the school grounds to the access doors, however please note that public paths around the school, do not fall under the responsibility of the school.

#### **Covid and Isolation Updates**

#### New Isolation Guidelines effective from 6<sup>th</sup> January 2022:

There is no longer a requirement for a follow up confirmatory PCR for asymptomatic individuals who test positive via LFD; they should isolate as a positive case as per the advice below. Individuals with symptoms should seek a PCR test. Further detail on the approach to self-isolation and testing for those with symptoms, or those who test positive, is available at NHS Inform. The new guidance came into effect from midnight 5<sup>th</sup> January 2022 for any new cases and is not retrospective.



Updated 06/01/22

From the 6th of January, there have been some updates to the guidance for Covid isolation, which you can see detailed in the flowchart above. Where a primary school pupil becomes a close contact

of a positive case in the community, they can still attend school as long as they do not have symptoms, and have a negative lateral flow each day for 7 days.

Where a pupil tests positive by lateral flow, they no longer need to go for a PCR test. They should isolate for 10 days, but can end their isolation early on day 7 **if** they return a negative lateral flow test on day 6 **and** day 7 of their isolation.
