Environment update

Following conversations with the children we have enhanced our block play area with the addition of large vehicles, road signs and road markings. The children have been able to extend their learning and role play, as a result of these additions. We have also replaced the sofa and dressing table within the Home Corner. Loose parts have been added throughout the Nursery which have developed the curiosity and creativity within the environment. These additions are only possible due to the support we receive during our fundraising activities from parents and carers.

A thank you to Mr Haxton who has laid laminate flooring in the Summer House, allowing a more comfortable environment for the children to explore when outdoors.

Mrs Haxton will be consulting with children and parents in the next few weeks about a Nursery trip for the summer term. We will be planning a fundraising event to cover the cost of the trip.









Attendance and Lateness

Attendance continues to be a strong priority across our authority, and nationally. At Mossend PS we are monitoring attendance closely, and working alongside partner agencies to support families in improving this.

There is a direct link between attendance and attainment and we cannot stress the importance of good attendance for your children.

We would be grateful if you could ensure that your child arrives at school for their start time so they do not miss key teaching and learning.

If you are needing to report pupil absence, this can be done via Parents Portal. If you are planning to phone the school, please call after 8.15am as the office is not staffed until 8.15am.



School Uniform for Session 2024/2025

We would like to say a huge thank you to our families for once again supporting our uniform policy. We are so proud of how smart the children look with almost all children wearing the appropriate uniform each day. A reminder of our uniform policy:

Formal Uniform

- Royal blue jumpers and cardigans (school branding optional)
- · White shirt and tie
- · Grey trousers/pinafores/skirts
- · Blue Tartan pinafores/skirts

Please note, the colour black is <u>not</u> in line with the school's uniform policy.

PE Kit

- · Royal blue hoodie or jumper
- White t-shirt/polo shirt
- · Black leggings, shorts or joggers

Children will be permitted to come to school wearing their PE Kit on gym days (twice per week) as long as they are in correct formal school uniform on the other 3 days.

Nursery Uniform (Uniform is not compulsory for nursery children)

Royal blue polo shirt and sweatshirt or own clothes.

Appointments (Reminder)

Where possible, appointments should be made out with the school day. If this is not possible then an appointment letter should be produced in advance of when your child needs to be excused from class time. Please call in advance and inform us of appointments.

We have an increasing number of children with afternoon appointments, particularly on a Friday. This is disruptive to learning, and to the running of the school through unplanned office interruptions at busy times.

World Book Day

Thursday the 6th of March is World Book Day and we have lots of activities planned to celebrate!

Tales and Teddies

On the 6th of March, children are encouraged to come to school with their favourite book and teddy and to get cosy in the class and enjoy some reading time.

Book Tokens

All children will receive book tokens before the 6^{th} of March, which can get them a £1 discount on books.

Reading Quiz

All classes will take part in a Reading Quiz where their knowledge of books will be put to the test. They will work with their peers in their House and we will see which House has the best book knowledge!

Reading Café

During our parent consultations, we will have our reading café open, where you can donate and/or select from lots of books while enjoying some refreshments.

Storytelling Tattie/Carrot Character

Children are encouraged to demonstrate our school value of creative by creating their favourite character from a book using a potato or carrot. They are asked to bring these in to school on the 6th of March where children will get to look at them all and vote for the most creative. Prizes will be given to the most creative designs.











Reading Books

We have recently purchased lots of new books for our upper school classes to read as part of their Literacy lessons. We have taken time to select novels which we believe are more interesting for pupils and are more relevant to them.

Your child should be taking their reading book home every night for homework. Can you please ensure that your child looks after their book and brings it to school every day as we do not have unlimited copies of the book to provide extras. This can have a negative impact on their learning during Literacy lessons. We appreciate your cooperation with this.

Mossend House System

Our House Captains and Vice Captains have been working together to take turns in preparing and presenting at our whole school assemblies. They have been enjoying taking on more responsibility and will continue this in to the last term.










Health and Wellbeing

Responsible will be the focus wellbeing indicator for March across all stages. Children at Early level will link this to Food & Health, First level will be taught through Healthy Lifestyles and Second level through Physical Education, Physical Activity and Sport.

All children who have not attended an after school or out of school club will be consulted in what clubs would interest them. We will then liaise with Active Schools and make offers of clubs based on these results.







Physical Education (Reminder)

We continue to ensure that our children receive their 2 hour entitlement of physical education each week. This comprises of 1 hour of indoor PE, and 1 hour of outdoor PE. On these days we would appreciate your support in ensuring that long hair is tied back, jewellery is removed, and children have their water bottles with them.


In relation to new piercings, these must be covered with a plaster either prior to coming to school, or children need to apply themselves in school. This is in accordance with NLC guidelines to ensure that children can access their entitlement safely.











Digital Update

Pupils and teachers from our senior classes have reported a positive impact the 44 new iPads are having on the quality of teaching and learning in the classrooms. We have invested in a further 10 new iPads which will be used in our junior and infant classes to support learning and teaching.

Over the next month, Mrs Lamont will consult with Digital Leaders on what the next steps for the school are in terms of digital improvement. We will keep you posted with what we decide to improve on.

Reading Schools

Pupils' Book Recommendations

Maya in Primary 7 highly recommends the book, "The Star Outside my Window" by Onjali Q. Rauf.

The book is about a boy who loves stars and wants to be a star hunter who can find his mum, who passed away, in the sky. The boy then struggles with new family dynamics.

Maya likes the book as she was not expecting the themes of family and loss and there were lots of twists and turns. She said if you do not read books, then this would be a great one to start with.

She recommends the book for older children, perhaps P3 and upwards. Younger children might struggle to understand the themes of the book.

Maya has also read and enjoyed the book "The Boy at the Back of the Class," by the same author.

Parents Portal

As of August 2024, we are now completely paper and cash free in line with North Lanarkshire Council policy. All communication and money collections will be processed online via Parents Portal. This includes the completion of the annual data check, EV5 forms for school outings and photograph permissions. Currently, we have 88% of our school community signed up for Parents Portal, however it is necessary for all parents to be signed up.
