How should they pay?
Activity sheet

Our shopping experiences can be very different depending on where we are and what we are buying.

Draw lines between the boxes to match up the scenarios and payment methods for each shopper.



Shoppers

Yasmin is 16 and has just started a new job. With her first pay packet she wants to buy some new shoes.

Imran lives on the 12th floor in a city centre flat. His oven is broken, so he needs to get a new one.

Jessie is having a busy day and needs some lunch. She rushes into a supermarket but leaves her bag in the office.

Sam is at home and finishes the last of the milk while making a cup of tea, so he grabs some change from the kitchen counter and heads out to buy some more.

Scenarios

- Shopper walks to the local shop, has a chat with the shop keeper, buys item.
- 2. Shopper either goes into a shop to try the item on or buys online.
- 3. Shopper goes into a shop and only has their mobile phone to pay for item.
- 4. Shopper uses a laptop/ phone to buy the large and heavy item online so it can be delivered.

Payment methods

- **A.** Uses a payment App to pay for item directly in-store.
- **B.** Uses a payment card or App as cash cannot be used.
- **C.**Can use a debit card, including contactless payment, or cash.
- **D.** Uses coins to pay for the item.
