# Money from around the world Activity sheet 

As you visit each 'country', write down the price of the item in that currency in the left-hand column. Then, using the formula at the bottom of the page, calculate its equivalent in British pounds.

| Cost of item in foreign currency | Exchange rate |  |  | Cost in British pounds |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
|  | 1 British pound | $=$ | 50 Thai baht |  |
|  | 1 British pound | $=$ | 90 Indian rupees |  |
|  | 1 British pound | = | 20 Egyptian pounds |  |
|  | 1 British pound | $=$ | 2 Australian dollars |  |
|  | 1 British pound | $=$ | 25 Mexican pesos |  |

## Remember, to turn an amount of money in a foreign currency into pounds...

| foreign |
| :---: |
| currency |$\div$| exchange |
| :---: |
| rate |$\quad=\quad$| amount in |
| :---: |
| British pounds |

For example: 180 Indian rupees $\div 90=\mathbf{2}$ British pounds
Hint: To make the numbers easier to calculate, try dividing both numbers by 10 . $180 \div 10=18 \quad 90 \div 10=9 \quad 18 \div 9=2$
