The 10 Commandments were a set of rules given to Moses from God on Mount Sinai They were to be given to the Israelites to show them how to obey God.


When we go to Confession we can reflect on the 10 commandments and think about whether or not we have obeyed them. This is called an examination of Conscience. This helps us to prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
