Glasgow Coat of Arms Design Challenge Activity

On the City of Glasgow's coat of arms, you can see some things that are thought to be linked to events from the life of Saint Mungo, the patron saint and founder of Glasgow. These are a fish, a bird, a tree and a bell. The fish has a ring in its mouth.

Design Brief:

Using the information below, you are going to design a coat of arms for Glasgow that represents the same meaning as the current coat of arms.

On the coat of arms is the motto **'Let Glasgow Flourish'**, which is a phrase that Saint Mungo is reported to have said during a sermon. This motto has to feature in your design.

Your design must include the fish (with the ring in its mouth), the tree, the bird and the bell.

There is a rhyme that is often recited when people from Glasgow are talking about the coat of arms and the story behind it:

There's the tree that never grew,
There's the bird that never flew,
There's the fish that never swam,
There's the bell that never rang.

You can use this rhyme as inspiration for your design.
