### **Literacy**

- Practise recognising your phonemes by sight. These are listed below.
- Can you find any phonemes in books? Write the words down? Can you read them?
- Can you think of your own words containing the phonemes?

- Read a story with someone. Can you discuss what happened at the beginning, middle and end? Can you write a summary? Remember to use your own words.
- Can you think of some questions about the book you have read? Remember to use question words. (when, where, what, why, how)
- Write your own story. Include \*when \*who \*where \* what happened \*what happened next \* a feeling
- Practise spelling your common words. You can practise with a grown-up or can try to bubble write, rainbow write or pyramid spell some of the words.

#### <u>Maths</u>

- Practise reading, writing and ordering numbers to 100 and beyond.
- Practise addition and subtraction within 20 and beyond, if you can.
- Go on a shape hunt. What shapes did you find? (2d and 3d shapes)
- Ask a grown-up to place out 4-5 coins. Can you count the money?
- Can you make specific amounts using coins? (within 20p/50p or £1)
- Play at shops and find the total of 2 items in the shop?
- Practise cutting food into halves and quarters.

#### Learning across the curriculum

- Choose an animal from another climate. Can you find out more about it?
- Can you make a picture of your animal?
- Create your own animal/creature that lives in a hot or cold climate. Give it a name.
- Choose a meal you have eaten. Can you find out where each thing on your plate came from? (plant or animal?)
