

**In the event of adverse weather conditions preventing children coming to school, the following tasks could be undertaken:**

**Activities for Primary 3**

- Practise writing your phonemes and phoneme words.  
**ai, ay, a-e, ch, ee, e-e, ea, ey, ie, igh, i-e oi, oy, oe, o-e, ph, sh, th, ng, ss, se**
- Go on a phoneme hunt around the house – how many words can you see with your phonemes in them?
- Play “phoneme eye-spy” with words containing a phoneme.
- Practise writing the common words you have learned. Try to write super sentences with these.
- Read a story book with someone – Can you discuss what happened at the beginning, middle and end? Can you talk about the **characters** and **setting** of the story?
  
- Can you make up and answer addition and subtraction numbers to 1000?
- Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times tables – ask an adult to practise with you.
- Ask an adult to make division questions for you – can you use your times table knowledge to help you solve them?
- Empty your piggy bank and sort the coins in order. Can you add the coins to find the total?
- Try to measure items in your home – can you convert cm to mm?
  
- Draw a picture of what you can see from your window.
- Design a front cover for a book.
- Find out more about the artist Steven Brown – can you find a painting he has done?
