What should I know?

Here are some things to practice before your child starts Primary 1. The items in **bold** type will be especially important to allow social distancing should this still be required. This will ensure the safety of your child as well as the staff caring for them.

- ✓ Your child should practise putting on shoes and zipping up jacket (velcro shoes are good!)
- ✓ Make sure your child can dress themselves (so they can change into shorts and tshirts for P.E. and then put uniform back on)
- ✓ Your child should practise going to the toilet, cleaning themselves and washing hands (*let us know if your child needs help with this*)
- ✓ Can pack own bag
- ✓ Put pencils etc into pencil case
- Tidy up, put away own toys
- ✓ Sing songs and rhymes, identify the rhyming words
- ✓ Play I Spy
- ✓ Practise sounds a, b, c ,d etc instead of A,B,C.D as this will help your child sound out words
- ✓ Read as much as possible: talk about the pictures etc, use things as clues, questions to help understanding: Who is, What are they doing..., What is happening.../what do you think is going to happen next, where.., why do you think...
- ✓ Talk about the beginning, middle and end of the story
- ✓ Counting songs
- ✓ Counting: Counting up, counting down
- ✓ Incidental learning: helping to set the table, how many spoons do we need etc, counting up and down the stairs, counting out money from the piggy bank; how many sausages are on the plate etc
- ✓ Use language: small, smaller, smallest, tall, taller, tallest etc
- ✓ Baking: measuring out ingredients.
