# Digital Home Learning Policy for Parents 2021/22

#### Introduction

At Newmains Primary we value the use of digital technology and are committed to providing an ICT curriculum to our learners as well as using digital technology to enhance learning throughout the curriculum in line with CfE and Education Scotland guidance.

'Digital technology can make a substantial contribution to this improvement agenda by enriching education across all areas of Curriculum for Excellence. If used effectively and appropriately, digital technology can enhance learning and teaching, equip our children and young people with vital digital skills and crucially, it can lead to improved educational outcomes.' (Enhancing Learning and Teaching through the use if Digital Technology, A Digital Learning and Teaching Strategy for Scotland, 2016)

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic we are moving to an era of online digital learning and the use of digital learning and digital skills have become more important than ever before. There is a need to have our learners become digitally literate to access high quality learning and teaching.

This policy sets out our approach to online digital learning, in line with NLC policy and Education Scotland guidance and outlines how we will meet the needs of our learners.

# **Delivery of Digital Online Learning**

At Newmains we are delivering an online offering through a variety of applications, programmes and websites.

# Teams

Our main platform for delivering online learning is Microsoft Teams. Teams is accessed by logging in with a Glow e-mail and password and can be downloaded as a Microsoft application. This is part of the national digital offering and is used as the learning platform throughout Scotland. Each class should have their own Team to act as a virtual learning and teaching area. Each Team can be set up in a way that suits the learners.

Tasks for our learners can be given in a number of ways within Teams and teachers will use their own judgement to determine the best way to do this for their learners. Tasks can be given by

- Uploading links, videos, documents or any other media directly to the 'chat' within the channel
- Uploading documents into files for the children to access
- Using Onenote to issue work to individual pupils and groups
- Using assignments to issue work to individual pupils and groups

#### Seesaw

Seesaw is an application that can be used to issue tasks to learners, where each pupil has access to their own learning journal. This is accessed through the website <u>app.seesaw.me</u> or by downloading the app. Learners use a unique 16 digit code or QR code to login.

This application is currently in use by P1-P.4 teachers and provides a way of giving tasks to groups and pupils that is easily accessed by the learners and allows the teacher to give individualised feedback.

# **Epic and Oxford Owl**

All learners will have access to e-books, teachers will chose an option for accessing e-books that suits themselves and their learners. Both <u>Epic</u> and <u>Oxford owl</u> are free to use e-book libraries that can be

accessed by teachers setting up and account and sharing their class access code with their learners.

Senior classes, who are reading novels may be given access to PDF novels by their teacher rather than having access to one of these websites.

### Sumdog

<u>Sumdog</u> is a website that engages learners in games to practice numeracy and literacy skills. Every teacher and pupil within the school has a login for Sumdog. Teachers can set up challenges and direct pupils to Sumdog depending on their learners needs. School challenges and challenges from NLC may also be set. Our administrator for Sumdog is Mrs Reilly

#### **NLC Virtual School**
