

#### Assessment of Pupil Progress – National Standardised Assessments

As part of the National Improvement Framework, the Scottish Government will collect assessment information about children children's progress in reading, writing, talking and listening and numeracy for primaries 1, 4 and 7. Most pupils are expected to achieve early level by the end of P1, first level by the end of P4 and second level by P7. From August 2017, new, national standardised assessments will be introduced in all schools in Scotland. These assessments will provide an additional source of nationally consistent evidence for teachers to use when assessing children's progress. Ongoing and informal assessment is, and will continue to be, a central part of everyday learning and teaching.

Please note:

- Every child in P1, P4, P7 and S3 will undertake national standardised assessments.
- Assessments will be completed online, giving teachers immediate feedback to help children progress.
- The assessments will be used to inform your child's class teacher how well he/she is progressing and plan next steps. There will be no pass or fail. The system adapts to your child's responses.
- There will be no set day or period of time. Teachers, in consultation with North Lanarkshire Council will decide on the appropriate time during the school year for completing assessments.
