
<u>Dress Down Day</u>

School Improvement Priorities 2020-2021

As a result of our self-evaluation, we have identified three priorities for our school this year covering the three broad areas of attainment, digital learning and health and wellbeing. We have put together a summary for you which I hope you find useful.

Our School Improvement Plan



Priority 1: To raise attainment in literacy and numeracy through the Broad General Education.

- Ensure all learners are working at a level in literacy and numeracy that is appropriate to their level, ensuring pace and challenge.
- Work with Bellshill Academy Cluster through the year to develop moderation and assessment.
- Increase opportunities for outdoor learning.
- Develop play based learning approaches into Primary 2 curriculum.

Priority 2: Develop digital learning and teaching.

- Identify that all learners have access to a device at home.
- Increase opportunities to develop digital learning within and out-with school.
- Use the internet safely and responsibly.

<u>Priority 3:</u> To support mental, social, emotional and physical wellbeing of staff and pupils.

- Develop further the core value of resilience through curricular experiences using the Building Resilience programme.
- Focus on supporting and promoting positive mental health across the school community.
- Achieve Silver Rights Respecting Status and work towards Gold.
- Offer targeted support where required.
