Literacy and English

This term the pupils in Primary 7B will be focusing on recount and persuasive writing. We will continue working through the spelling and reading programmes for the remainder of the year. We have just started reading our new class novel "The Mixed-Up Summer of Lily McLean" by Lindsay Littleson and we will continue to read through this.



Numeracy and Mathematics

Mental Agility focus this term is using different strategies to help with adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing. The children will continue to challenge themselves using these strategies with the daily 'Chilli Challenge'.

The children will continue to revise their times tables through fun activities, such as 'Times Tables Bingo' and compete against each other in 'Around the World'.

The children will be focusing on the topics of Data Handling, Money, Angles and the Importance of Maths in the Wider World.



Health and Wellbeing

The 2 hours of Outdoor PE per week will include socially distanced playground games, fitness and team games.
