At Noble Primary School, we share and celebrate learning in lots of different ways including:

September: Right of the Month


All classes will be learning about Article 12 of the UNCRC this month.

Article 12 states all children have the right to be listened to and taken seriously.


Children and young people don't have as much power as adults. They can't vote, and
