### Literacy and English



#### What will we be learning?

##### Reading:

This term we will be focussing on comprehension and how to structure a full and accurate response to different types of questions. We will be using peer assessment to improve speed, accuracy and fluency in reading.

##### Writing:

We will be continuing with narrative writing with a focus on portal stories and stories about change. We will also be learning how to write a discursive text.

##### Talking and Listening:

This term we will be practising taking turns and giving feedback. We will be building confidence when speaking to a partner, a group and the class as a whole.

### Numeracy and Maths

#### What will we be learning?

This term we will be continuing our work on Fractions, decimals and percentages including finding percentages and problem solving. We will be using various tools for measuring and converting between measurements. We will be using our number knowledge to solve basic expressions and equations including the speed, distance, times equation.

We will investigate different types of angles, symmetry and transformation including drawing and using maps and the eight compass points with co-ordinates.



## Health and Wellbeing



### What will we be learning?

**PE Focus:** Our PE days are Monday (outdoor) and Thursday. On Mondays, we will be working on Athletics, building stamina in running, jumping and throwing activities. On Thursdays, we will participate in racquet activities to improve accuracy, hand to eye co-ordination and build confidence-using resources.

**Building Resilience:** Our building resilience theme is Expect the Unexpected. We will be thinking about change and how to cope with changes that may be expected or unexpected, positive or negative.

**Right of the Month:** We will be investigating Article 3 - All decisions made about me must be in my best interest. In Article 24 - I must have access to the best possible health. In Article 6 - Life, survival and development.

**SHANARRI Focus:** Our SHANARRI indicator for this term will be included and we will be consolidating all indicators. We will also cover our RSHP programme.

### IDL and Topic Work

Our interdisciplinary topic will be about Iceland: The Land of Fire and Ice.

In Science, we have completed our learning on Space and The Solar System and will be moving on to investigate genetics.
