Finally, to all our families, have a fantastic and restful break when it comes.



W UNCRC Article 29

I have the right to an education which develops my personality, respect for others' rights and the environment

Article 29 of the UNCRC says that a child or young person's education should help their mind, body and talents be the best they can. It should also build their respect for other people and the world around them. In particular, they should learn to respect:

- their rights and the rights of others
- their freedoms and the freedoms of others
- their parents
- the identity, language and values of countries—including their own.

Education should prepare children and young people for a responsible life in a free society. It should teach them how to live in an understanding and tolerant way that is non-violent and that respects the environment.

Focus on Attendance

We monitor pupil attendance daily. Regular school attendance will ensure that your child does not miss out on any key learning and teaching opportunities.

The average attendance rate across North Lanarkshire is around 95%. Your child's report will include a summary of their attendance at school. Below is an infographic of how that translates over the session.

Above 95%	95% or less	90% or less	85% or less	80% or less
leads to improved and high achievement which means greater success!	This is the same as missing 9 school days; nearly 2 weeks!	This is the same as missing 19 school days; almost 4 weeks!	This is the same as missing 27 school days; just less than 6 weeks!	This is the same as missing 36 school days; just less than 8 weeks!
