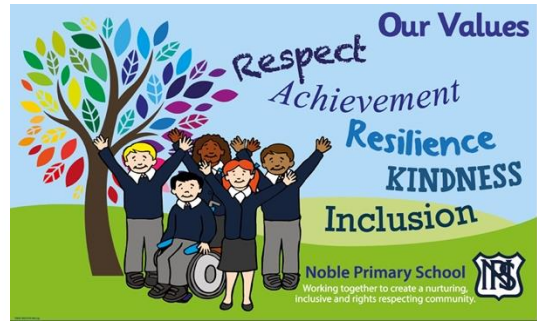

October: Right of the Month

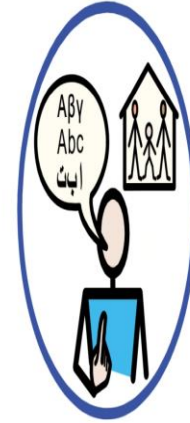
Article 30 of the UNCRC outlined that children and young people who belong to a minority group have the right to share their culture, language, and religion with other people in that group.

Parents/ carers are invited to join us on Friday 13th October at 9.30am. £1 entry will be donated to school funds.

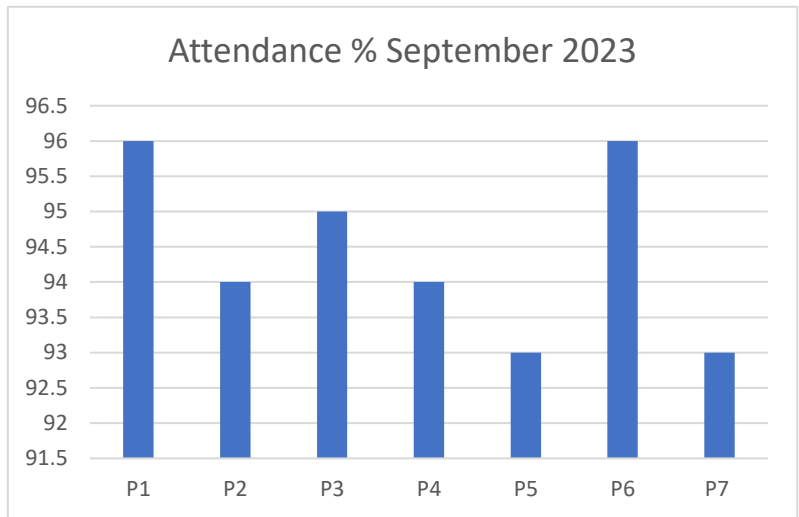
As mentioned above, donations of non-perishable items for our foodbank collection would be appreciated.



Improving Attendance

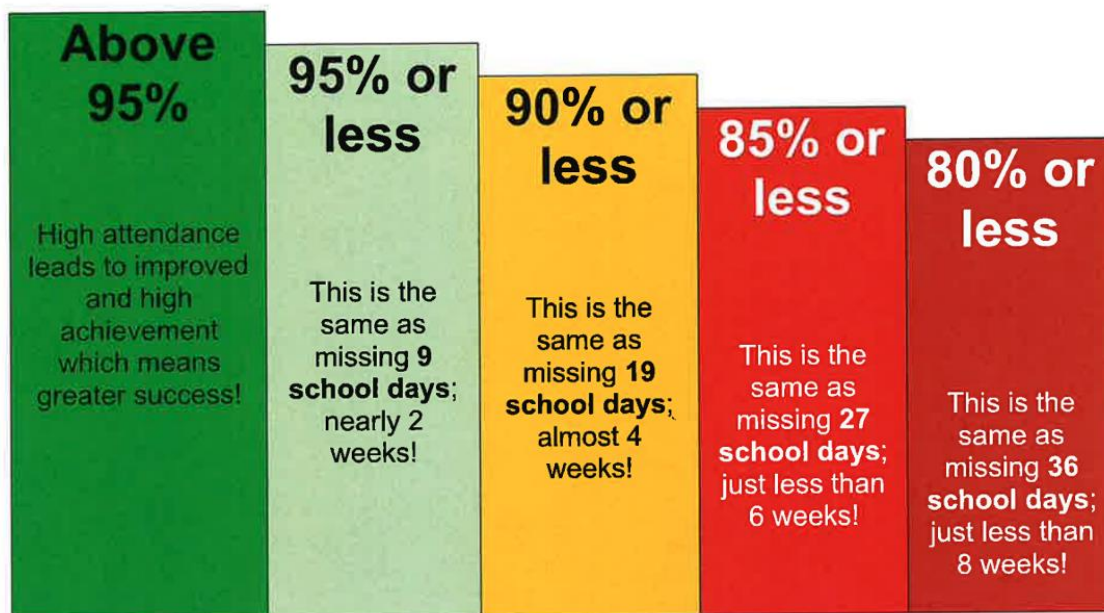
Our average attendance rate last year across the school was 91% which is 4% below our 95% average.
