

March: Right of the Month

Article 29 of the UNCRC says that a child or young person's education should help their mind, body and talents be the best they can. It should also build their respect for other people and the world around them. In particular, they should learn to respect:

- their rights and the rights of others
- their freedoms and the freedoms of others
- their parents
- the identity, language and values of countries—including their own.



WUNCRC Article 29

I have the right to an education which develops my personality, talents and abilities.

It says education should prepare children and young people for a responsible life in a free society. It should teach them how to live in an understanding and tolerant way that is non-violent and that respects the environment.

What will this look like for my child's experience at Noble Primary?

- All children will participate in pupil voice activities that are designed to give us a better understanding of how they view the curriculum offer at Noble Primary School.
- They will suggest further ways to develop talents, interests, and creativity.
- Curriculum content questionnaires will be used to audit variety of learning environments e.g. outdoors, field trips and excursions.
